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Foreword

The 'Visitation Statistics, 2000/2001' report, covering the period April 1, 2000 to March 31, 2001, is published annually to supply selected information on provincial parks and recreation areas. This publication provides data on the following aspects of park visitation:

Camping Use Statistics

Based on camping permit sales analysis, and / or reasonable estimates of camping use and camper surveys.

Day Use Statistics

Collected through Automatic Traffic Counter readings and traffic surveys.

Group Camping Use Statistics

Based on group use permit sales analysis.

Fixed Roof Accommodation Use Statistics

Kananaskis Country - number of guests reported.

Visitation statistics are reported both at the park and 'area' level (i.e., individual campgrounds, day use areas, group use areas, fixed roof accommodation facilities). Statistics are summarized for provincial parks and recreation areas. The data collection systems associated with these visitation statistics are discussed in detail in the Introduction Section.

Ten years of historical statistics for camping, group camping, fixed roof accommodation, and day use are included in this report.

In addition to visitation, this report provides information covering facilities and services for selected sites. To put the province in perspective, maps (see Appendix) are also included. Maps 1 and 2 are for Southern and Northern Alberta respectively. They show the location of sites reporting visitation statistics. 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Introduction

This report presents Visitation Statistics for the period of April 1, 2000 to March 31, 2001. It is **IMPORTANT TO NOTE** however, that overnight statistics (i.e., camping, group camping and fixed roof) and automatic traffic counter readings (required to derive estimates of day use) were only collected for the months of April to October. Where applicable (see note below), adjustments were made to the April - October visitation statistics to represent a fiscal year total. This change was made in order to facilitate a review and system change of the park user statistics collection system (PUSC). Once completed, this new system will simplify data requirements and minimize requirements for off-season collection.

NOTE: To determine the impact of off-season use on the annual total visitation figure (i.e., derive 'inflation factors' to adjust the April - October period to a fiscal year total), an analysis of historical visitation data was completed. For purposes of this report, the following information is provided:

- o Camping and group camping for the April to October period represents on average, 99% and 95% respectively of the annual total provincial overnight visitation. Therefore reported camping and group camping are assumed to represent the total fiscal year.
- o Day use (excluding Kananaskis Country) for the April to October period represents on average, 80% of the annual total provincial day use

visitation (variations ranged from 60% to 100% between sites). Therefore reported provincial and historical day use for 2000/2001 is adjusted to represent a total fiscal year based on a provincial and site-specific inflation factor(s).

- o Kananaskis Country day use for the April to October period represents on average, 60% of the annual total Kananaskis Country day use visitation. Therefore reported Kananaskis Country day use and historical day use for 2000/2001 is adjusted to represent a total fiscal year based on a Kananaskis Country and site-specific inflation factor(s).
- o Fixed roof for William Watson Lodge (Kananaskis Country) for the April to October period represents on average, 60% of the annual total visitation to the site. Therefore reported William Watson fixed roof visitation for 2000/2001 is adjusted to represent a total fiscal year based on a site-specific inflation factor. Whereas reported Kananaskis Village fixed roof visitation for 2000/2001 is an estimated value based on a previous three-year average.

Information is presented for selected provincial parks and recreation areas, at both the park level and 'area' level (e.g., individual campground statistics for those parks with multiple campgrounds).

The majority of provincial parks (68) and approximately half (108 out of 256) of the provincial recreation areas report visitation. Recreation areas that have negligible visitation are not included in the statistics collection program. Collection is not cost-effective in these situations. Visitation data is not collected for the province's 3 wilderness areas, 152 natural areas, 16 ecological reserves, Willmore Wilderness Park and 28 of the 32 provincial wildland parks because these areas are generally not road accessible and have minimal use.

Tables summarising statistics for camping use, day use, and group use, are included in this report. Fixed roof accommodation use is included in the provincial visitation statistics table. Charts are also included to facilitate further comparison of selected visitation. It is important to note that individual campground statistics do not include overflow occupied campsite nights. This statistic is reported at the park level only. Also, for those parks that have more than one day use area, the Park level day use statistic total discounts for any multiple visitation (i.e., a day use party who visits more than one day use area in the park).

Visitation data can be further analysed to meet specific information requirements. These queries should be directed to the Program Evaluation and Research Coordinator. Brief descriptions of the data collection methodologies used for each category of use statistics follow.

Camping Statistics Methodology

Camping statistics are based primarily upon information obtained from camping permits. These permits are issued via two systems:

- o The Standard Camping Permit system; and
- o the Self-Registration Permit (envelope) system.

Standard Camping Permits and associated periodic surveys provide information on occupied campsite nights and average camping party size. This information enables calculation of the number of campers (see Glossary).

Occupied campsite nights are based on the premise that a site is considered occupied when a permit has been issued and that site is occupied by at least one camping accommodation unit.

Self-Registration Permits also provide statistics on occupied campsite nights, and requires periodic surveys to provide data on camping party size.

Backcountry camping statistics are only reported for designated backcountry campgrounds in Kananaskis Country. These statistics are derived through a backcountry reservation service, which includes the issuing of backcountry camping permits. A periodic analysis of the backcountry camping permits provides data on camping party size.

Day Use Statistics Methodology

For the provincial parks and Kananaskis Country, peak season day use statistics are based on figures collected from automatic traffic counters. Adjustments to these counts include determining the ratio of day use vehicles to all other vehicles entering or exiting the park and average party size. It is important to note that the ratio of day use to all other vehicles also discounts for multiple visitations to day use facilities or multiple stops along recreation corridors. Both the ratio of day use to all other vehicles and average party size adjustment factors are obtained through a periodic day use calibration survey.

The survey involves stopping traffic on 20 randomly selected days during the peak season (April - September) to conduct brief interviews. Daily vehicle counts and the survey information are analysed to ***yield estimates of day use visitation.***

When traffic counter readings are not available, the total vehicle counts are supplemented by estimates. This, plus the fact that adjustment factors obtained from past day use calibration surveys are becoming increasingly dated, serves to illustrate the need to ***interpret the day use data with caution.***

The day use methodology for provincial recreation areas adjusts traffic counts for camper traffic (determined from permit sales and estimates of

non-compliance and multiple entries/exists) and estimates of non-recreational vehicles to yield survey information and the estimates of day use visitation. This approach to day use estimation is referred to as the 'Residual Method'. This approach is also used for reporting off-season day use estimates at the majority of provincial parks, which have not completed an off-season traffic survey. Due to the change in the collection methodologies at provincial recreation areas, no historical day use comparison is provided prior to the implementation of the residual method.

Group Camping Statistics Methodology

Currently the group use permit system collects information pertaining to group camping unit nights, group campers, and occupancy. A survey component of the group use permit provides the average number of people in a group unit, which is required to calculate the number of group campers.

Fixed Roof Accommodation Use Statistics Methodology

'Occupied room nights' and 'number of guests' are based on actual figures reported for William Watson Lodge and estimates of use for Kananaskis Village in Kananaskis Country.

Historical Comparison

Tables summarising statistics for camping use, day use, group use, and fixed roof accommodation use, over a ten-year period, are included in this report.

Visitation Highlights For 2000/2001

Total Visitation

Over 8.7 million people visited provincial parks and recreation areas during the 2000/2001 fiscal year. This represents a slight increase of 1.7 percent from 1999/2000 fiscal year.

Overnight Visitation

The total number of campsites in provincial parks and recreation areas in 2000/2001 fiscal year was 13,110. This represents a slight decrease over the previous year.

The total number of camping parties decreased 12.9 percent from the 1999/2000 fiscal year. However it is important to note that for a number of parks and recreation areas, camping data was either incomplete or not available. These provincial parks and recreation areas are identified with footnotes in the statistics tables.

Group camping increased by 3.2 percent from the 1999/2000 fiscal year. As with camping, group camping data for a number of group use areas was either incomplete or not available. These group use areas are identified with footnotes in the statistics tables.

Day Use

An estimated 7 million-day use visitors used provincial parks and recreation areas during the 2000/2001 fiscal year. This represents an increase of 4.7 percent from the 1999/2000 fiscal year.

It should be noted that for a number of provincial parks and recreation areas throughout the province, day use data was either incomplete or not available. These provincial parks and recreation areas are identified with footnotes in the statistics tables.

Historical Comparison

Between 1991/1992 and 2000/2001 there was a very modest increase in the total provincial visitation, averaging 0.1%¹. A comparison of these years indicates that the number of years where there was a negative (5 years) or positive (4 years) change in visitor numbers is nearly evenly split. The 10-year mean for provincial visitation was 8.7 million annual visitors with a high of 9.0 million annual visitors occurring in 1993/94.

Final Synopsis

In comparing the fiscal year 2000/2001 over the previous year, the province only experienced a decrease in the number of campers. Overall, total visitation to provincial parks and recreation areas increased slightly. It is important to note that for several areas, data was either not available or incomplete. For the most part, this effected the reported day use visitation. Clearly this has an impact on the reported visitation but the extent cannot be ascertained at this point in time. The information contained in this report is the best available at the time of preparation.

Glossary

Camping Use Definitions

Average Camping Party Size - Average number of people per occupied campsite. This is determined for each campground by a periodic survey of camping permits.

Campers - Average camping party size multiplied by the number of occupied campsite nights.

Camping Accommodation Unit - A tent, a tent trailer, a truck camper, a van, a travel trailer, a fifth wheel trailer, or a motor home.

Occupied Campsite Night - One campsite occupied for one night.

Overflow Unit Night - One camping accommodation unit in an area designated as an overflow camping area for one night.

Group Use Definitions

Average Group Camping Party Size - Average number of people per group. This is determined for each group use area by a periodic survey of camping permits.

Group Unit Night - One camping accommodation unit in an area designated as a group use area for one night.

Group Campers - Average group camping party size multiplied by the number of group unit nights.

Day Use Definitions

Average Day Use Party Size - Average number of people associated with a day use party entering a provincial park or recreation area for one day or portion of one day without staying overnight. This is determined by a periodic survey of day users.

Day Use Party Visit - Person(s) in a vehicle entering a provincial park or recreation area for one day or portion of one day without staying overnight.

Note: In the case of 'walk-in' day users, a party is considered to be one or more individuals who appear to enter the park together.

Day Use Visitors - Person(s) making a recreational visit to a provincial park or recreation area for one day or portion of one day without staying overnight.

Fixed Roof Accommodation Use Definitions

Occupied Room Night - One room occupied for one night.


Guests - Actual number of people per occupied room.



Provincial Total - 2000/2001**





