

Pierre Grey's Lakes Provincial Park is located in the foothills of the Rocky Mountains 120km north of Hinton, just off Hwy. 40. The park contains a beautiful chain of five lakes. Two of them are stocked with rainbow trout. One is stocked with brook trout. The park is named for Pierre Gris (Grey), a Métis who ran a successful trading post in the 1880s and '90s. In winter, Pierre traded with trappers and hunters bringing furs from eastern slopes of the Rockies. When spring came, he travelled to Lac Ste. Anne and Edmonton to sell furs and purchase supplies. Pierre and his wife Anne died during the 1918 flu epidemic. The remains of their trading post are still visible along the lakeshore.

There is a total of 83 sites (61 power and 22 non-power). The campgrounds are equipped with boat launches, fire pits, fish cleaning stations, cook shelter with stove, vault toilets, pump water, playgrounds, firewood sales and electrical sites. The nearest potable water and sani dump station are available in Grande Cache to the north, or Gregg Lake Campground to the south (during operating season only). Campsites are available by reservation up to 90 days in advance. Reserve online at [reserve.albertaparks.ca](http://reserve.albertaparks.ca) or call 1-877-537-2757. There are also non-power and power campsites available as First Come First Serve.

Recreational activities in the park include front-country hiking, fishing, canoeing, kayaking and power boating (electric motors only). The park offers great cross-country ski trails through the forest and along the lakeshore. Ice fishing is also popular on all the lakes

McDonald Lake is a trophy fishing lake with some special regulations. Please check the "Alberta Sport Fishing Regulations" for details.
