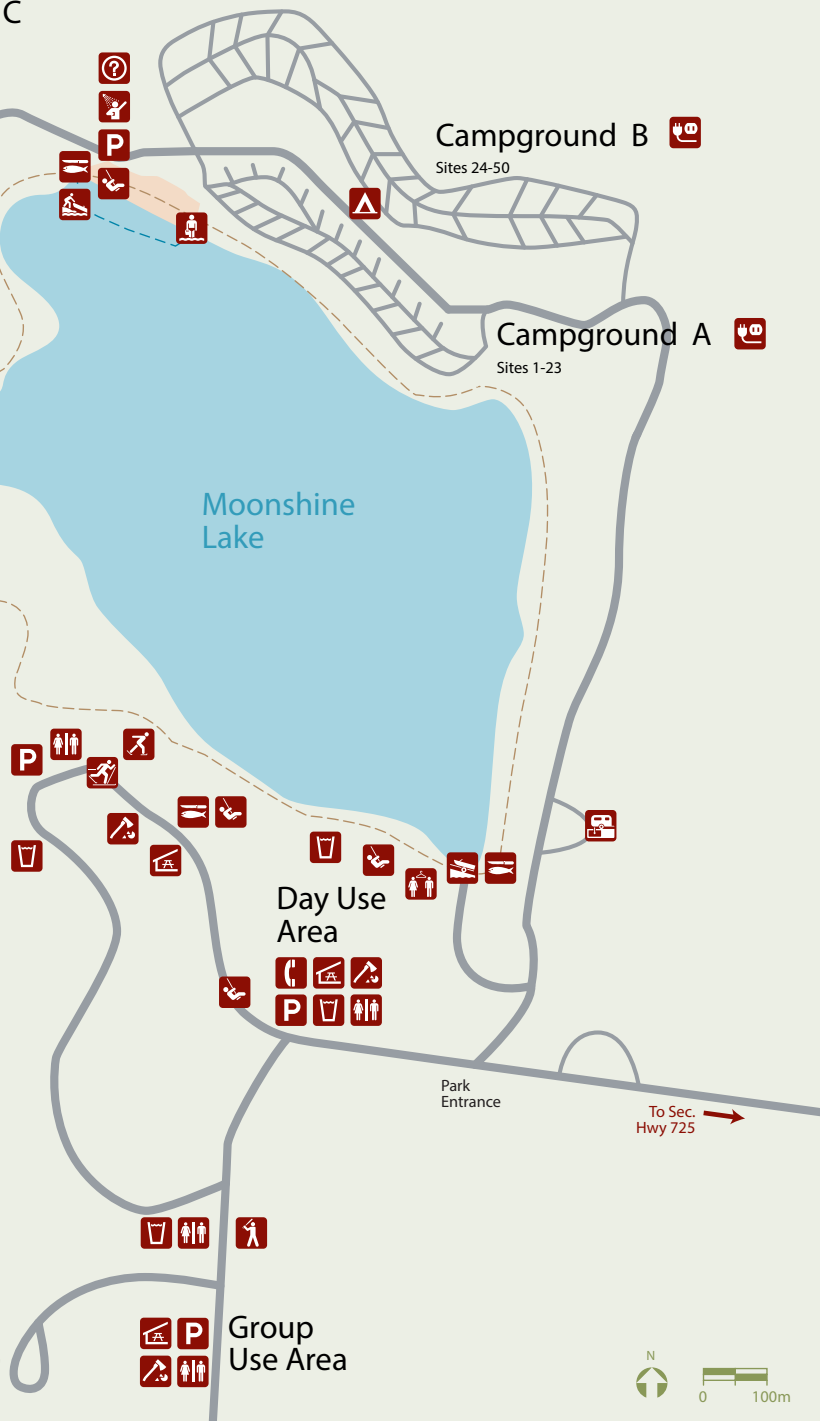

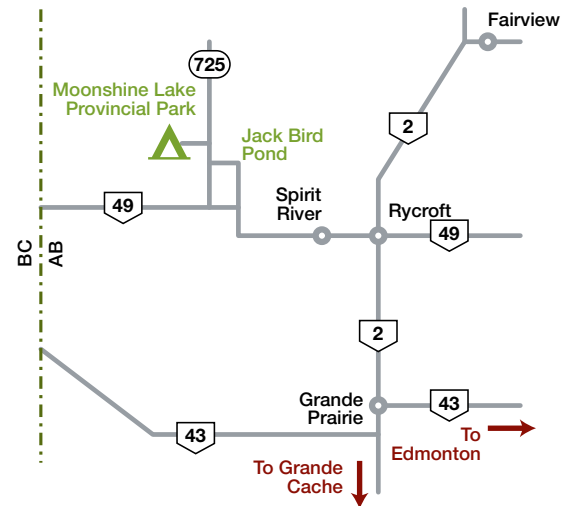

Moonshine Lake Provincial Park was established in 1959 and covers an area of 1103 hectares. The Lake, formally known as Mirage, had a name change after two local men accidentally spilled their home-brewed moonshine into the water while transporting it around the lake.

In addition to 3 wooded camping loops, the park offers spacious picnic and group use areas. Moonshine Lake is popular for fishing, either from shore, the docks, or from non-gas powered boats. There is a beach with a playground for children, walking trails around the lake and wildlife viewing platforms. In winter come for cross-country skiing, snowshoeing and skating on an outdoor rink.

Jack Bird Pond, located about 3.5 km SE of Moonshine Lake, provides excellent opportunities for viewing waterfowl.

Alberta's provincial parks have been established to provide visitors with enjoyable outdoor experiences.

- Deposit garbage in containers provided. Do not burn or leave garbage in fire pits.
- Alcohol is prohibited except in registered campsites.
- Clean up after your pet.
- Keep your pet on a leash. Pets are not allowed on public beaches, in playgrounds or in buildings.
- Build fires in stoves provided.
- Keep vehicles on established roadways.
- Hunting and carrying of firearms are prohibited.
- Leave a clean campsite for the next visitor.
- Quiet hours are 11:00pm to 7:00am.
