Marks-Kucher 2017 Student Bursary



The Marks-Kucher Student Bursary is intended to provide experience in vertebrate field-work for students in graduate or undergraduate palaeontology programs (students pursuing acceptance into a graduate or undergraduate palaeontology program may also apply).

This bursary consists of financial support to cover the program costs of either a one or two-day guided excavation experience in Dinosaur Provincial Park (DPP). The guided excavation program provides opportunities to gain valuable field experience with traditional techniques in one of the richest fossil locales in the world. In association with the Royal Tyrrell Museum of Palaeontology, and with an experienced palaeontological technician as your guide, the practical knowledge and insights you gain will be of value to you for the rest of your career.

One-Day Guided Excavation Bursary

This is an opportunity to participate in an authentic and systematic ceratopsian bonebed excavation that provides specimens for ongoing research conducted by the RTMP (Royal Tyrrell Museum of Palaeontology). A regular program day is 7 hours long (9AM to 4PM) and requires participants to be outdoors for the majority of that time. Please check the weather to ensure you are dressed comfortably for the conditions.

The day begins at the Visitor Centre where you will be met by David Lloyd (our palaeontological technician and the program leader) for an orientation to the park, our fossils, and the research project. You will also receive training before your work in the quarry begins to ensure proper techniques are employed. The day will likely include some hiking and prospecting for new fossil finds. All tools are supplied and lunch is provided.

Two-Day Guided Excavation Bursary

If you are awarded the two-day excavation bursary, your bursary will cover accommodations, lunches, dinner on Day 1 and breakfast on Day 2.

If You Are Successful

Successful applicants will be contacted by email by **May 12, 2017** and will be informed if they have qualified for a 1 or 2-day excavation program. Transportation to the Park, accommodations and any other related expenses are the responsibility of the student if they are not stated as included in the bursary award. Two day bursaries may be applied to either currently scheduled 2-day programs or a combination of available 1-day programs.



Dinosaur Provincial Park is located 48 km northeast of Brooks, Alberta.

Camping and Comfort Camping facilities are available onsite and bookable through www.reserve.albertaparks.ca. There are also hotels and B&B's in the Brooks area and within the County of Newell.

Arrangements for additional tours or extended stays are the responsibility of the student. Students interested in additional excavation days may also request use of the "VIP Campsite" to reduce associated costs.

- Two or more litres of water
- Sunscreen, insect repellent, camera and sunglasses.
