Regulations

- Quiet hours in effect 11pm to 7am.
- Please drive cautiously and obey all speed limits—park roads are also used by pedestrians and cyclists
- Prevent damage to trees and vegetation; please keep your vehicles on designated roads and parking areas
- Alcohol is only permitted in registered campsites—it is not permitted on roads, trails, beaches, washrooms, day use picnic areas and other public areas
- For the safety of your pet, wildlife and visitors, keep your pet on a leash at all times. Please pick up after your pet.
- Pets are not permitted on beaches, swimming areas or public buildings.
- Campfires permitted only in designated fire pits and stoves. Never leave campfire unattended and make sure it is out completely before leaving your campsite.
